二、綜合測驗 10%

KEELUNG CIVIL SOCIETY groups and local politicians have <u>11.</u> plans to build a liquified natural gas (LNG) receiving station by Taipower. Protests around the issue took place earlier this month.

Taipower currently intends to reclaim 18.6 hectares of land near the Hsieh-ho Power Plant for the receiving station.

Environmental groups are against the construction plans <u>12</u>. this may threaten biodiversity, particularly regarding coastal wildlife and coral reefs. These groups have sought to <u>13</u>. that Keelung's potential as a tourist destination could be threatened by pollution.

Groups opposed to the receiving station <u>14.</u> organizations such as Society of Wilderness, Wild at Heart Legal Defense Association, Citizens Association for Public Policy, Taiwan Watch Institute, Left Corner Foundation, and others. <u>15.</u>, several local politicians from both the pan-Blue and pan-Green camps oppose the receiving station. One of them, Wang Xing-zhi, in particular has sought to appeal to Keelung mayor Lin Yu-chang, bringing up Lin's close relations with former Yilan county magistrate Yu Shyi-kun, and stating that Lin should act to protect Keelung's environment as Yu <u>16.</u> for Yilan.

With plans by the Keelung city government to hold an environmental impact assessment (EIA) on June 9th, this was criticized by civil society groups as a perfunctory action, seeing as committee members are set to step down by the end of the month. <u>17.</u>, civil society groups called for waiting for new committee members to take office before conducting an EIA, rather than rushing through the process.

This LNG terminal was <u>18.</u> proposed by the KMT during its time in power and opposed by the DPP, but the two parties <u>19.</u> positions on the issue when in power and when serving as the opposition. Takeaways from a grim weekend for Republicans in the election that won't end

CNN — It was a disappointing weekend for Republicans and ex-President Donald Trump as Democrats kept the Senate for two more years. <u>21</u>.

And even with the GOP appearing to slowly march toward House control – promising to make Biden's life deeply uncomfortable for the rest of his term with investigations into his administration and even his son, Hunter.

<u>22.</u> So it's obvious why Democrats are celebrating the come-from-behind victory of Sen. Catherine Cortez Masto in Nevada Saturday night that handed them their 50th seat and control of the Senate. Senate control is huge for multiple reasons, not least because by pulling it off in deeply unpromising political conditions, Democrats cemented the most stunning showing for an incumbent president's party in a first-term midterm election since George W. Bush in 2002.

"<u>23.</u>" Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer told reporters on Saturday night after CNN and other media outlets projected the Nevada race.

More importantly, the Democrats' continued hold on power gives Biden two more years to remake the judiciary and to counter the influx of conservative judges confirmed during Trump's presidency. <u>24.</u>

The failure of Republicans to capture control means that the White House will be spared a relentless onslaught of Senate investigations and subpoenas to match those likely to be pouring out of the House if, as expected, the GOP finally clinches a majority in that chamber. <u>25.</u>

(B) Lascaux is famous for its cave paintings, found in a complex of caves in the Dordogne region of southwestern France, because of their exceptional quality, size, sophistication and antiquity. Estimated to be up to 20,000 years old, the paintings consist primarily of large animals, once native to the region. Lascaux is located in the Vézère Valley where many other decorated caves have been found since the beginning of the 20th century (for example, Les Combarelles and Font-de-Gaume in 1901, Bernifal in 1902). Lascaux is a complex cave with several areas. It was discovered on 12 September 1940 and given statutory historic monument protection in December of the same year. In 1979, the Lascaux cave were added to the UNESCO World Heritage Sites list.

Sections have been identified in the cave: the Great Hall of the Bulls, the Lateral Passage, the Shaft of the Dead Man, the Chamber of Engravings, the Painted Gallery, and the Chamber of Felines. The cave contains nearly 2,000 figures, which can be grouped into three main categories - animals, human figures and abstract signs. Most of the major images have been painted onto the walls using mineral pigments although some designs have also been incised into the stone.

Of the animals, there are 90 paintings of stags. Also represented are cattle, bison, felines, a bird, a bear, a rhinoceros, and a human. Among the most famous images are four huge, black bulls in the Hall of the Bulls. One of the bulls is 17 feet (5.2 m) long - the largest animal discovered so far in cave art.

Additionally, the bulls appear to be in motion. There are no images of reindeer, even though that was the principal source of food for the artists. A painting referred to as 'The Crossed Bison' is often held as an example of the skill of the Palaeolithic cave painters. The crossed hind legs show the ability to use perspective.

Since the year 2000, Lascaux has been beset with a fungus, variously blamed on a new air conditioning system that was installed in the caves, the use of high-powered lights, and the presence of too many visitors. As of 2006, the situation became even graver - the cave saw the growth of black mold. In January 2008, authorities closed the cave for three months, even to scientists and preservationists. A single individual was allowed to enter the cave for 20 minutes once a week to monitor climatic conditions.

(C) Lionel Messi is, once again, carrying the hopes of a nation in what will be his last World Cup.

The Argentina star, now playing at his fifth and final tournament, has been unable to capture the trophy during his glittering career.

Messi and his compatriots were stunned in their World Cup opener in 2022, losing 2-1 to Saudi Arabia, which dented their hopes. They responded with a 2-0 win over Mexico as <u>the PSG star</u> netted a stunning opener to put them back in the hunt in Group C. Enzo Fernandez scored Argentina's second, and an old letter written by the 21-year-old has re-emerged. It came back in 2016 when Messi announced his international retirement after another tournament near miss.

Argentina lost out in the Copa America final to Chile on penalties with Messi missing from the spot. He decided to walk away from international football - a decision he would reverse months later - but in the aftermath, Fernandez penned an open letter pleading with his compatriot to stay.

The then-teenager accepted that they were not aware of the pressure facing him but asked that the seven-time Ballon d'Or winner considered his future as he asked for forgiveness.

His letter read: "How are we going to convince you? If we are disastrous. How are we going to convince you? We never had 1 percent of the pressure that you have on your shoulders. You wake up in the morning, you look in the mirror and you know that a crowd of over 40 million people wants you to do the perfect thing and it has been ridiculously imposed that they can demand it.

"How are we going to convince you? If we fail to understand that you are a human being, a person with incomparable talent, the best player on the planet, but a person after all."

"How are we going to convince you? If we don't stop for a moment to realize that you are not responsible for the anger that losing causes us, which often has more to do with our own frustrations that are reflected there. Let's look in the mirror and ask ourselves if we demand from ourselves 1 percent of what we demand from this guy we don't even know.

"Do what you want, Lionel, but please think about staying. Stay and have fun... in a world of ridiculous pressures, they manage to get the most noble thing out of the game, the fun. Seeing you play with the light blue and white is the greatest pride in the world. Play for fun, because when you're having fun, you have no idea how much fun we have. Thank you and forgive us."
